CRAFTNOW PHILADELPHIA EXPLORES ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS AT ITS SEVENTH ANNUAL SYMPOSIUM

October 13, 2021, Philadelphia, PA - For the last seven years, <u>CraftNOW Philadelphia</u> has hosted CraftMONTH, a series of events in November alongside the <u>Philadelphia Museum of Art Craft Show</u>, to celebrate and showcase Philadelphia's contemporary craft scene.

CraftNOW was founded in 2014 by a consortium of individuals, galleries, museums, universities, retailers, and civic organizations. November, proclaimed as "CraftMONTH" by the City of Philadelphia, inspires CraftNOW's widespread and diverse celebration of the region's rich legacy of craft, its internationally-recognized contemporary craft scene, and its important role as an incubator for arts based in wood, clay, fiber, metal, and glass.

On Friday, November 5, CraftNOW's free annual symposium – a signature event of Philadelphia's CraftMONTH – will be hosted in-person at the <u>Center for Architecture</u> (1218 Arch Street). CraftNOW will also stream the program <u>virtually</u> to allow for national and international audiences to take part and learn about Philadelphia's innovation in craft. The symposium is free and open to the public.

The symposium's theme, *Environmental Effects*, will examine how communities and interiors shape our experiences, sustainability issues are highlighted through craft, and the impact of our contemporary material culture. CraftNOW will host a series of presentations complemented by shorter, moderated panels led by curators, experts, and artists throughout the afternoon.

"This year's theme was inspired by a combination of critical issues in craft and our collective culture," said Leila Cartier, Executive Director of CraftNOW. "Climate change and social reform are addressed through contemporary craft practices and exhibitions. We are exploring how the objects in our homes have been central to our lived experiences over the last year and, on the opposite end of the spectrum, how craft is often responsive to ecological challenges."

The symposium will culminate in a keynote address from **Dr. Kelli Morgan**, a curator, educator, and social justice activist specializing in American art and visual culture. A critical race historian, her interdisciplinary research and curatorial work examines and theorizes how American artists, artwork, and institutions can challenge and rectify systemic racism. Over the course of her career, Dr. Morgan has taught at the Tyler School for Art and Architecture at Temple University, Wayne State University, and the University of Michigan. Additionally, she's held curatorial positions at the Indianapolis Museum of Art at Newfields, the Birmingham Museum of Art, and the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine arts.

CraftNOW's *Environmental Effects* Symposium will take place on Friday, November 5, from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Advanced registration for both in-person and virtual attendance is required.
